No one is doing a true risk-based approach to Infosec

Risk based Infosec doesn't exist (yet)

Infosec talks about this a lot, but the instrumentation simply hasn't existed to date. That means we're working in a world where everyone is simply guessing. It's time for that to change.

I'll explain...

Talent (hiring our way out of the problem)

I talk to a lot of customers and partners. While some are good, there is an apparent decrease of capability in the average employee. This has been validated anecdotally by many old-school practitioners as well.

They don't know about the subject matter for which they are hired. They don't know about the tooling.

They appear to have no mentorship above them who can help.

How did this happen?!

- Brain drain
- Money driving talent acquisition instead of passion
- Quantity over quality
- Bad CISO incentives

The real Incentives of a Security Executive



Don't get fired: look good for the execs/board. Hire a large team (even if they have no talent) and focus on dashboards, even if they are useless or are even detrimental.



Don't increase personal liability: Hire people to take on the liability for you (the cheaper the better). Avoid any knowledge of issues for which you will be blamed for not fixing.



Quit before people blame you and have a couple wins for the resume: Have at least two successful initiatives even if they have zero or even net-negative impacts for the company.

The Perverse Incentives of **EASM**



"As a CISO, liability lies in knowing about vulns and not doing anything about them."

EASM finds more assets

Those assets have vulns

"My personal liability goes up without an underfunded herculean effort by a team who doesn't know how to fix the issues? Why would I want that?"

The Internet Needs to Scan Everything

You can't

You (probably) don't know where everything is to scan it since you have no EASM tool.



You can't

No scanning company on earth can manage scanning every asset on earth.




You can't

You (probably) can't afford it. You can't even afford what's on your current roadmap or you'd already be doing it.

You can't

Your people can't manage even the current volume vulns let alone more plus your employees' abilities are worse than ever

The Issues with WAFs



The Current State & Demise of Stoplight Infosec



What does a "high", "critical", "red", "94%", "5", "C-", "CVSS9.2" etc. mean? Seriously!



"Stoplight
Infosec" is never
in context of the
dollars & cents
value of an
asset or the
actual damage
potential.



If you don't have context you're likely fixing the wrong things and wasting resources on bad guesses.



Some vulns shouldn't be fixed and some vulns that would normally be ignored should be.

Averaging Stoplight Infosec

If the average replacement cost of an old laptop is \$100 and the average vulnerability is a "5/10" does that mean the worst vuln in the world is only double that? \$200?



Averaging Risk



This is **not** a plan



Current CISO Conversations

CISO to CFO: "We have two command injections, three SQL injections, one cross site request forgery, and a misconfigured htaccess file on Apache, so I want \$50k to change our grade from a B- to a B+."

CFO to CISO: "WTH are you talking about?"

Future CISO Conversations

CISO to CFO: "We have \$2M of expected lost over the next 12 months and I'd like \$50k to remediate that."

CFO to CISO: "Let me see your math."

Why Insurance Is Coming And You're Already Behind













You get cyber insurance.
You need insurance for contracts and want it to mitigate risk.

You do
nothing to fix
your issues.
You haven't
instrumented
correctly and
don't know
where the
real risk is.

You get breached.
You either fixed the wrong thing or didn't fix anything at all.

You get a payout (excluding force majeure or war-time claims), assuming you were proven negligent.

Shift Left

We aren't even sure if this works in terms of monetary loss (yet measuring it is tough), and if it does, it only works on new applications which are a minority (20+ years of tech-debt says so).

Disaster Recovery

The best solution for ransomware. The upside is it's cheap. Just test it regularly. If it takes too long to recover, you've got work to do.

SecDevOps

This likely does work, but largely due to increased business continuity/ease of deployments/backups and obfuscation of the attack surface.

Al for Logs

Likely will improve efficacy of finding more bad stuff, so worth spending investment here to reduce headcount-talent needs.

Positive Stuff I Didn't Cover

My one big takeaway...

CISOs will someday decide what not to fix and security will therefore become a profit center.




